CONNECTING PEOPLE IN THE HEART OF JESUS

They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. Matthew 21:7

In our world today, we are quickly grabbed by what is different. We are drawn to the extremes. We are impressed with the spectacular. Bigger is better and the next great thing must be bigger still. We see it in presidential campaigns, blockbuster movies, and billion-dollar Super Bowls.



If it's going to get our attention, it's got to be big. If it's going to impress, it's got to be spectacular. This also seems to be the

case when it comes to the work of God. We are impressed when it comes to the creation, the crossing of the Red Sea, the thunder and lightning of Mount Sinai, the conquering of Canaan, and the slaying of giants. There is great attention on angel choirs and Magi, walking on water, feeding a crowd of five thousand, and raising the dead. Our lectionary begins Advent with Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, with impressive crowds and praise. But what's up with the humble donkey?

The crowds are gearing up for the entrance of the king and a renewed kingdom. The Pharisees anticipate the heavy hand of Rome. Jesus comes to bring entrance to the true Kingdom of God. In contrast to the other two, the entrance of the Kingdom of God in the work of Jesus is miraculously unspectacular. In a couple of chapters, Jesus will remind the disciples to "watch and pray." We don't know the time. We often misinterpret the way He comes and even why he comes.

The work of salvation and the renewal of God's people is miraculous and incredible. But it quite often occurs in unspectacular ways. Your birth, your new life in baptism, your participation in the Holy Supper, and the ways you share His grace are often as mundane as they are magnificent. The world takes no notice of Advent and the beginning of a new church year. We hear the promise of Jesus' return in glory. We get a peek at angel choirs and Magi from the East. But most of the world takes no notice. There is not much to see. Except for His trip to Egypt, He traveled no further than from Norfolk to Sioux City or Seward to Grand Island.

He taught with authority and healed many with ease, but in the end, most found Him easy to ignore. Yet His one solitary life has made an impact on our world and on your heart unequaled in all of history. God's work continues to progress in miraculously unspectacular ways. Certainly, there has been the impressive work of fast-growing missions and great joy with large groups of new members. But much of God's work happens without fanfare or notice. We celebrate a baptism, but the date is quickly lost. The Lord's Supper is a great renewal of the heart, but we quickly turn to the next task on the schedule. Much of a sermon can be easily ignored and the rest quickly forgotten...but through it all the Spirit brings fruit to bear. A word of encouragement. An act of kindness. A prayer for strength. A loving touch... None will cause the earth to tremble, but like wind through the branches, the Spirit moves. In all these little things, far more than the spectacular, the work of Christ is done, and the presence of Christ comes near. Recognizing His coming is one thing. Understanding what He is doing is another. "My kingdom is not of this world." He comes not to make life simple or easy for you, nor to make life miserable for your enemies. He comes to bring righteousness, to proclaim your forgiveness, to change your heart, and to renew your life. This is the miraculously unspectacular work of God as He bestows on us the miraculous gift of faith. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus, come.


Family Christmas (December 22) - WRAP IN LOVE



<u>Call to Order/Opening Devotion and Prayer</u> led by Colby Kolm at 11:34 am.

<u>Admission of New Voting Members</u> – Randy Howser made a motion to accept Kay Knapp, Kayla Roberts, and Aaron Pokorny as new voting members. Rod Zohner seconded. Motion carried. <u>Approval of Minutes dated September 29, 2024</u> - Gary Borgelt made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Curt Wragge seconded. Motion carried.

Board Reports

Treasurer's Report by Katie Schnitzler: The actual income received is higher compared to this same time last year. St. John ELC continues to receive contributions from the childcare tax credit. The balance of the line of credit at the end of the fiscal year was converted to a long-term note at 7.65% interest. The debt balance remains at \$408,352. Bruce Grant motioned to accept the treasurer's report. Second by Randy Howser. Motion carried.

Trustees Report by Caleb Zohner: Fall clean-up day is scheduled for Saturday, November 9, at 9:00 a.m. Bob Barry will join the Trustee Board to fill the last vacant spot. The trustees continue to work on the parsonage, which is close to being finished. The trustees are always looking for more help with snow removal. Please contact Caleb or Katie if you are able to volunteer in this capacity.

Elders Report by Dane Prauner: Transfer out - Emilee (Straka) Seier to Immanuel Zion Lutheran Church in Albion. The Elders Board served treats after church the past four Sundays. Randy Howser motioned to approve the transfer out. Second by Gary Borgelt. Motion carried.

Evangelism Report: None.

Parish Ed Report by Christy Schmidt: Boxes will be packed for Operation Christmas Child on Wednesday, October 30 at 6:00 pm. Boxes will be filled that night, but can also be taken home to fill and then returned to church to have them shipped out. The blessing of the boxes will happen on Sunday, November 17.

Parochial Ed Report by Nick Onnen: The teachers recently attended the church workers conference in Kearney. At the conference, Mr. Jon Baumgartel received the Nebraska District LCMS Middle School Teacher of the Year award! IGNITE is scheduled for Saturday, March 1, 2025. The girls' volleyball teams had successful seasons. The "A" team finished the season with only two losses and were runners-up in the top division at the state tournament. The "B" team finished as state champions in the C division. St. John had 42 students apply for scholarships. Last year the school operated with one less teacher by combining the 3rd and 4th grade classes. Next year's 3rd grade class will be too large to combine the grades. Mr. Onnen continues to look for creative ways to fill the void of a teacher for next year. This year St. John is receiving \$60,000 from other churches to support their members that attend St John school.

Early Learning Center (ELC) Report by Tiffany Pokorny: The ELC received a \$250 Thrivent grant to purchase supplies to participate in the City of Battle Creek's Trunk or Treat event. The ELC board will meet on October 28.

Stewardship Report by Vince Hoehne: The Stewardship Board and the Youth Group will be passing out candy bars and hot chocolate on Halloween night. The Stewardship Board will be serving treats after worship services on November 9 and 10. The Day of Giving is Tuesday, December 3. There is a \$10,000 matching challenge for the Day of Giving with all funds raised going towards the long-term note payment.

Old Business: None.

New Business

- a. The 2024-2025 Proposed Budget / ELC Taskforce Report by Katie Schnitzler: At the previous meeting, the Voter's passed a one-month budget through the end of October which also included the implementation of staff raises. This past week, the ELC task force held a town hall meeting to share information about the nationwide childcare crisis with community members. Initial research shows that if the ELC were to become its own 501(c)(3) it would still require support from the church. The pros and cons of ELC separation have been discussed in detail and at this time the task force feels that separating the ELC would result in a sacrifice of the mission work being done there. The task force will continue to look at modifications that can be made to ELC operations that keep it within the means that the church can financially support. Lonnie Jacobsen with the district office has been inspiring members to change their mindset from, "What can others do for us?" to "What can we do for others?" The ELC task force feels that continuing to operate as one ministry prioritizes the mission focus. There were two budget options presented. The first option was to approve a budget for the next quarter and re-evaluate the financial position at the end of January. The second option was to approve a budget for the remainder of the fiscal year. Second by Dane Prauner. Motion carried.
- b. Proposed Constitution / Bylaws Report by Colby: The new proposed constitution was discussed. After some time, it was decided to table the discussion and revisit this topic at a meeting held specifically to discuss the Constitution at a later date.
- c. District Convention Lay Voting Delegate and Alternate: After some discussion, Brad Prauner made a motion to nominate Jeff Borchers as the lay voting delegate to represent St. John Lutheran Church at the District Convention in June 2025. Brad also motioned that Colby Kolm would serve as the alternate lay voting delegate. Second by Randy Howser. Motion carried.
- d. Nominations for District President, Regional Vice President, and Lay Member of the Board of Directors: After some discussion, Bruce Grant made a motion that St. John Lutheran Church nominate Richard Snow for District President and Michael Awe for Regional Vice President as they are both eligible for nomination and have ties to our district. Second by Rod Zohner. Motion carried. After more discussion, Dane Prauner made a motion to nominate Randy Howser for the position of Lay Member of the Board of Directors. Second by Vince Hoehne. Motion carried.

<u>Other</u>

Call Process Update by Katie Schnitzler: Next weekend the call committee will be polling the congregation on whether they feel it would be beneficial to have a <u>conversation</u> about a potential long-term partnership between St. John and Our Savior. Regardless of the results of the vote, the call committee will continue with the process of searching for a pastor.

Next Council Meeting - Monday, November 25, 2024, at 8:00 pm.

Bruce Grant made a motion to adjourn. Second by Randy Kossmann. Motion carried. Closing prayer led by Pastor Lee at 1:34 pm. Minutes submitted by Mandy Lewis.



Share: Highs of 1st Semester

 8th Grade Trip to Camp Luther: Starting the year off by setting the tone and expectations with the 8th grade has become a staple of what we do. Testing, recognizing, and celebrating the unique ways God created them, and then setting class goals was an incredible experience.

> •Mr. Baumgartel Recognized as NE District Middle School Teacher of the Year: We have some phenomenal teachers, and it was wonderful to see Mr. B receive recognition for his hard work and dedication.

> > • **Gym Floor Operable:** While the gym floor still had some issues this summer, they were moderate enough for us to host volleyball onsite at St. John this year. Last year, we were unable to do so, making this season the first time we could host volleyball on the new floor!

• **Sports Success:** "Whatever you do, work at it with your whole heart, as though working for the Lord." (Colossians 3:23) For the third time in four years, our Lady Hawks took home the Class A1 Lutheran State Runners-up trophy and finished the year with a record of 21-2. Additionally, our cross-country team had state qualifiers, and our Class C athletes celebrated a state championship!

- CKLA (Common Knowledge Language Arts): Our K-2 grades switched to a new language arts (reading and English) curriculum this year, and it has been amazing! Teachers have been thrilled to see students exceeding expectations. This program emphasizes nonfiction texts, exposing students to a wealth of historical, scientific, and other educational content.
- External Financial Support: Our Savior, Grace Lutheran, and St. Paul Buffalo Creek have all stepped up to support families with students at St. John. This new support, in addition to IGNITE on March 1, makes our school finances significantly more stable!
- Nebraska School Choice: While a one-time event, St. John students received \$53,900 in scholarship funds for the 2025-26 school year. Regretfully, LB 1402 was repealed by a 57% to 43% vote, largely due to opponents spending nearly \$7 million to repeal the \$10 million appropriation.
- Childcare Tax Credit: As of this writing, over \$128,000 in funds have been redirected from state taxes to St. John through the CCTC Act. Our families claimed a remarkable 6.94% of the total \$1.8 million claimed statewide thus far—an incredible achievement!
- **Continuity of Staff:** For the third consecutive year, we've had no staff turnover. Continuity allows everything to run more smoothly and efficiently, and we are blessed with a talented and dedicated team!
- **Trust & Partnership:** It's always humbling to be entrusted with other's prized treasure, their children. The relationships and solid communication with our parents this semester have allowed our staff to be effective in helping our students grow academically and spiritually.

Share: Lows of 1st Semester

- **Parent-Teacher League:** This group works tirelessly to support our school and ELC, planning fun events, raising funds, and showing appreciation. However, many active parents have older students, and there is a need for more parents to step in and take the reins.
- **Technology:** St. John is a leader in technology, often serving as a model for other schools. However, our Chromebooks and chargers are nearing the end of their lifespan, and our MacBooks will also need updating within a few years.

• Schedule Modifications: Smaller schools require flexibility. This year, we've relied on staff to cover vacant roles temporarily and long-term. Adjusting to changing schedules, working with schools for lunch, sports co-ops, and special education services has demanded adaptability and a focus on the big picture.

Read: Psalm 35:5-9

Let them be like chaff before the wind, with the angel of the Lord driving them away! Let their way be dark and slippery, with the angel of the Lord pursuing them! For without cause they hid their net for me; without cause they dug a pit for my life. Let destruction come upon him when he does not know it! And let the net that he hid ensnare him; let him fall into it—to his destruction! Then my soul will rejoice in the Lord, exulting in his salvation.

Talk: Trusting God's Plan Over Our Own

"What a miserable reading. Why would anyone CHOOSE to write an article about this? It sounds spiteful, vengeful, and full of un-Christian-like sentiments."

Those were my first thoughts when reading this passage. However, this was a recent scripture reading during worship and too often we shy away from the uncomfortable verses rather than diving in to understand. At face value, it's easy to pull a snippet from the Bible out of context and miss the deeper message. This is why understanding the full context is so important. Let's take a closer look. In this reading, David is unjustly pursued by those who seek to destroy him. Rather than taking matters into his own hands, David calls out to the Lord for justice. He prays for God to scatter his enemies and for their own traps to ensnare them. Ultimately, David places his trust in God's deliverance.

This aligns with the events of 1 Samuel 24, where Saul, consumed with jealousy, is hunting David. David finds himself with the perfect opportunity to take vengeance—alone with Saul in a cave. To the outsider, this might have seemed like a golden chance to end his persecution. But David refuses to harm "the Lord's anointed," recognizing that vengeance isn't his to take. Instead, he entrusts his life to God's plan.

It's easy to see ourselves in these stories. How often do we choose our good plan over God's perfect plan? We want quick solutions and control over our circumstances, but God sees the bigger picture. David's restraint and trust point us to the ultimate example of God's plan: Jesus.

When humankind fell into sin, God's good and perfect will unfolded with the birth of a baby in a manger. Jesus came into the world to take the punishment we deserved, covering all our wrongdoings and offering us an unearned place in heaven. His birth was the beginning of the greatest act of deliverance the world has ever known.

This passage reminds us that just as David trusted God's timing and plan, so can we. During this Advent season and beyond, may we find peace in the promise that God's plans are always for our good and His glory.

Bless:

May the Lord strengthen our trust and faith, that in all circumstances we seek not our plans, but His perfect will, just as He gave us the ultimate gift through the birth of His Son.

Pray:

Father, thank You for the blessings of the first semester. We entrust our challenges to You and pray that You would equip us to navigate them while honoring You. Forgive us when we fall short, and thank You for Your promise of grace. Amen.

MAINTAINING ROUTINES DURING THE HOLIDAYS: FINDING BALANCE FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

Why Routines Are Crucial

Routines help children feel safe, secure, and in control of their environment. Research highlights their role in promoting self-regulation, emotional well-being, and even academic readiness later in life. Predictable routines reduce stress and enable children to transition smoothly between activities. They also offer opportunities for learning, from sequencing skills to vocabulary development during familiar tasks like brushing teeth or setting the table.

Adapting Routines for the Holidays



The Nebraska Child Care Tax Credit (CCTC) offers nonrefundable tax credits for qualifying contributions to benefit families and child care centers like St. John ELC. Contributors, including various entities, can claim credits up to 100% of their contribution, supporting programs, staff training, facility improvements, equipment acquisition, and employee retention. Contributions to programs in opportunity zones or serving children in subsidy programs can qualify for a 100% tax credit, promoting investment in early childhood education and supporting children's development at St. John ELC.
