The Epiphany Star and the Wise Men

In Matthew chapter two we read the account of the wise men who journeyed from the East to worship Jesus. The Bible tells us they followed a star. Many people have wondered about that star. Was it a miraculous star created by God just for the purpose of leading the wise men? Others have looked for astrological evidence of such a star at the time of Jesus' birth.

We know that close to the time of Jesus' birth there were some unusual astrological occurrences. For example, Jupiter came into conjunction with Regulus, the star of kingship, the brightest star of the constellation of Leo. Leo was the constellation of kings, and it was associated with the Lion of Judah. Later there was a conjunction of Jupiter and Venus, the two brightest objects in the sky save the sun and moon. Predictions of these conjunctions were made 400 years prior to the birth of Christ.

Whether this was a miraculous star or an unusual astrological phenomenon, we know that God used these events to serve the purposes of His plan of salvation. The wise men must have had some Biblical knowledge of the coming King of Judah. Along with other scientific observations, they were led by God to Jesus. No one really knows how many wise men there were. Many people assume there were three because of the three kinds of gifts they brought. There may have only been two wise men or many more than three.

One thing we do know for certain is that they looked upon Jesus as a new born king. That's amazing when you consider the poverty and the low class into which Jesus was born. Yet the wise men looked beyond the outward circumstances to the realities of God's revelation. Oh, how much we need that same view today. It is very easy to see the chaos and the degradation that

grows stronger and stronger in our world. It would be very easy to lose hope that God is real and that He is coming again in glory. Nevertheless, like the wise men, we can see reality in the promises of God. Just as the wise men search the Scriptures and followed the star, so we are called to follow Christ in His word and look beyond all the outward circumstances.



<u>Approval of Minutes</u> from August 26, 2024 - Dane Prauner motioned to approve the August meeting minutes as written. Second by Christy Schmidt. Motion carried.

Board Reports

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> by Katie Schnitzler – Since January 1, St. John Ministries has received \$128,000+ in donations for the Child Care Tax Credit. That equates to just over 5% of the total \$2,500,000 allotment for the credit. Praise God! The Day of Giving will be December 3. There is a \$20,000 match. The funds raised will be used to make a payment on the long-term note. There was \$53,900 received in scholarship funds for school families from LB 1402. These funds will be moved to a six month CD to earn interest until they are needed for the next school year. Dane Prauner made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Christy seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Trustees Report</u> by Caleb Zohner – The trustees are finalizing crews and preparing equipment for the snow removal season. The parsonage updates have been completed. The trustees have a live-in occupant for the parsonage to help maintain the property during the winter months. The occupant will vacate the property in the spring of 2025.

<u>Elders Report</u> by Dane Prauner – The elders will serve soups for the Advent meal on December 4.

Evangelism Report by Tia Eriksen - Evangelism will be giving the chapel message on Wednesday, December 18 and will be serving the Advent meal that same evening with Parish Ed.

<u>Parish Ed Report</u> by Christy Schmidt – Parish Ed will be serving the Advent meal on December 18 with Evangelism. The Christmas break for Sunday school is quickly approaching. There will be no education hour on Sunday, December 22 due to the family Christmas worship service. Sunday school will resume January 12, 2025.

<u>Parochial Ed Report</u> by Nick Onnen – AD, Staci Kolm, organized "Senior Day" at St. John which will be Friday, December 6. St. John Alumni who are current seniors in high school were asked to return to St. John to speak with the eighth grade class and then round up for a friendly competition of volleyball verse the staff. St. John students and staff are busy preparing for the Christmas concert happening on December 15.

Board Reports

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> by Katie Schnitzler: The donations collected for the Day of Giving totaled just over \$57,000, including the \$25,000 match. Praise God! Those funds will be used to pay down the debt. Katie was informed that St. John Lutheran Church is the beneficiary of approximately \$200,000 that is left in assets in the Richard Kleider estate. Tia Eriksen made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Christy Schmidt seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Trustees Report</u> by Caleb Zohner: There is currently an occupant in the parsonage to help watch over the house and report any issues to the trustees. The parsonage has been occupied for less than a month and already a few issues with water leaks have been identified. The trustees are very thankful to be made aware of these things now and to correct the issues before we have a new pastor to occupy the parsonage. The Trustees are also considering different options for lawn care for the next season.

<u>Elders Report by Dane Prauner: There are no transfers in or out. The Elders served the Advent meal on December 4. Gary Borgelt volunteered to serve as the Elders representative on the Endowment Committee for a five-year term. During Christmas Eve worship services the Elders are going to assist the Volks in cleaning up the wax from the candles after each service.</u>

<u>Evangelism Report</u> by Tia Eriksen: The Evangelism Board will be serving the Advent meal this Wednesday (December 18) with Parish Ed. The Evangelism Board will also be leading chapel this Wednesday (December 18) as well.

<u>Parish Ed Report</u> by Christy Schmidt: The proceeds from the Advent meal will help cover the cost of 2025 VBS t-shirts. The Parish Ed Board packed goodie bags for the family Christmas service this coming Sunday (December 22).

<u>Parochial Ed</u> Report by Nick Onnen: The school Christmas concert was a success. There are constant reminders of the need for the school due to the current environment of the world and the importance for more people to be redirected to the truth. Staffing needs for the next school year are being assessed and the school board is evaluating different ways to keep operating costs for the congregation and tuition for the families at a minimum. A couple weeks ago St John alumni, who are currently seniors in high school, came back to meet with the St. John 8th Grade class. It was a day full of good discussions and a St John Staff vs. Seniors volleyball game.

<u>Early Learning Center (ELC)</u> Report: There were no board members present to report, but please remember the birthday party for Jesus is this Thursday, December 19, starting at 6:00 pm.

<u>Stewardship Report</u> by Vince Hoehne: The Stewardship Board discussed the scholarships St. John will offer in 2025. The board decided to continue to offer the Concordia Church Worker Scholarship and LHNE Scholarships, as those are supporting students in Christian education and ministry work for the future. The High School Senior Scholarship will not be offered in 2025.

a. Approval of 2025 Non-Taxable Allowances for Rostered Workers by Katie Schnitzler: Katie reported the proposed percentages for each rostered worker. The list will be attached to the official copy of the Council minutes. Rostered employees must meet three "tests" to achieve this classification. These percentages don't change what we pay our workers. It's just a classification for W-2 reporting. The first test is that these percentages are approved in the minutes. As we approach the end of the year, we have so much to celebrate at St. John Early Learning Center! Here's a look at the exciting updates happening in our classrooms, playground, and beyond.

Playground Project Update

Thanks to the incredible generosity of grants and community support, our long-awaited playground renovation is officially underway! The toddler area will be the first to see improvements, providing a safe and engaging space designed specifically for our youngest learners. This project has been made possible by a \$136,000 Restoration grant from Nebraska DHHS, along with additional funding from our community, including \$1,800 raised during our successful golf scramble fundraiser. These updates will enhance outdoor play opportunities, supporting children's physical development and imaginative exploration.

STEAM Makerspace Launch

We're excited to announce the creation of our brand-new STEAM-focused makerspace. This innovative area will allow children to explore Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math through hands-on, creative projects. With the generous \$20,000 grant from the Connie Fund, this space will feature engaging materials and activities that spark curiosity and foster critical thinking. Whether children are building, experimenting, or expressing themselves through art, the makerspace will be a hub for discovery and learning.

Supporting Physical Activity and Healthy Lifestyles

Promoting physical health is an important part of our mission. Thanks to a \$500 PATCH grant, we've been able to purchase new physical education equipment for our after-school program. These tools help us incorporate fun, active play into the children's daily routines, encouraging healthy habits and teamwork.

Celebrating Community Support Through Tax Credit Contributions

We are overwhelmed with gratitude for the incredible support we've received through the Child Care Tax Credit (CCTC) program. This initiative has allowed us to raise over \$120,000, which will directly benefit St. John Ministries and the families we serve. This milestone underscores the generosity of our supporters and the shared commitment to early childhood education as a vital part of our community's future.

CHILDCARE TAX CREDIT

The Nebraska Child Care Tax Credit (CCTC) offers nonrefundable tax credits for qualifying contributions to benefit families and child care centers like St.

John ELC. Contributors, including various entities, can claim credits up to 100% of their contribution, supporting programs, staff training, facility improvements, equipment acquisition, and employee retention. Contributions to programs in opportunity zones or serving children in subsidy programs can qualify for a 100% tax credit, promoting investment in early childhood education and supporting children's development at St. John ELC.

From the Principal



"Ships don't sink because of the water around them; ships sink because of the water that gets in them. Don't let what's happening around you get inside you and weigh you down." I have this quote posted in my office as a reminder not to let the challenges of the day become an internal struggle. It can be easier said than done.

This quote also speaks to the Christian's battle in our world. How does one live surrounded by sin and not let it penetrate the heart? We're not just facing an uphill battle but a vertical cliff! We're raising children in a world obsessed with promiscuity, vulgarity, and violence. It's not just something distant—it's in their faces constantly. Temptations are ever-present, dancing across their phones and devices, chiming, dinging, and ringing to draw them in.

How do we teach a child to go against societal norms and choose behaviors that won't harm their relationship with Christ? The answer: we teach them. Over and over. Children, like their adult role models, cycle through falling into sin and seeking repentance. We must help them identify the contrast between the world's ways and the ways of our God.

We face the challenge of raising children to be in the world, but not of the world. As Jesus prayed in John 17:14-16, "I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world."

I thank God for a team of partners who walk alongside me in parenting, guiding not only my own children, but other students as they navigate their walk with Christ. I'm grateful to work in a school and ministry where the staff help redirect students' focus, leading them back to repentance and forgiveness through Christ.

We don't have a ministry for perfect people. As Jesus said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." (Mark 2:17) How blessed we are to recognize our need for a Savior. How blessed we are to have Jesus, who loves us even when we don't act like we belong to His flock and when we feel unlovable.

"Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person." (Colossians 4:6) In a dark and lost world, there is opportunity because the darkness accentuates His light. "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)

Living as a Christian in a broken world will always be a challenge, but we are not without guidance. We have Jesus' example, His words, and His forgiveness. We also have the promise that we are not left to this task alone. The Holy Spirit empowers us to withstand the waters around us, keeping us afloat and strong as we navigate life's storms.
