ROMANS

A fourteen-week series on Paul's letter to the Romans

A Sermon Series & Bible Study Beginning June 1

God is good, we are not, He has a plan!

The Book of Romans is the Apostle Paul's encouragement to the church in Rome in the face of persecution. Paul's primary theme in Romans is the essential gospel and God's plan of salvation and righteousness for all humanity.

Written during the Apostle's stay in Corinth, the book of Romans is a unique treasure in our New Testament. It's the first book primarily addressed to a Gentile Congregation, marking a significant shift in the early Christian community. This historical context adds a layer of depth to our study, allowing us better to understand the challenges and triumphs of the early church.

This summer, worship with St. John as we walk through one of the most foundational books in the Bible for the teachings of the Christian faith. The Book of Romans explains, step-by-step, why and how God saves us through His Son, Jesus Christ. Beginning June 1, this 14-week worship series will show God's truth for our lives as Paul proclaims our salvation through Christ's sacrifice in His bitter death and glorious resurrection. The victory that Christ has won for us spurs us to turn away from the darkness of sin and death and live steadfast under the cloak of His righteousness. In addition to worship, the pastors will host a weekly Bible Study on Sunday mornings following worship to dive deeper into the weekly themes and to further nourish and strengthen our faith in our Risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Council Meeting Minutes- Monday, May 20, 2024

In Attendance: Reid Ehrisman, Colby Kolm, Katie Schnitzler, Christy Schmidt, Ann Grant, Karen Grant, Todd Roberts, Kelsey Schnoor, Nick Onnen, Vince Hoehne, Pastor Lee Weander, Neal Acklie, Sara Anderson, Tiffany Pokorny, Deanna Anderson, Nikki Houlden, Steven Whitney

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Reid Ehrisman at 8:14 pm. Reid opened with devotion and prayer.

Karen Grant made a motion to approve the April 22, 2024, council meeting minutes. Second by Christy Schmidt. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> by Katie Schnitzler. The same pattern continues financially - income continues to increase, but not at the same rate as expenses. The current operating debt balance is just over \$300,000. There is approximately \$112,000 in operating obligations to be paid by May 31, so that debt is likely to increase. Deanna Anderson motioned to accept the treasurer's report. Second by Karen Grant. Motion carried.

<u>Trustees Report</u> by Todd Roberts. The Trustees finished up some small projects around campus. They finalized their SMART goals for the coming year. They are finalizing the list of names to serve on the Trustee Board for 2024-2025.

<u>Elders Report</u> by Steven Whitney. Pastor Lee attended the last elders' meeting. The meeting discussed the budget and SMART goals for the coming year.

Evangelism Report by Sara Anderson. The Evangelism Board is working on goodie bags for individuals starting the new member class. They are planning an event during a baseball game as a rally for VBS happening this summer. Orphan Grain Train has a service day at the end of VBS week, and they are looking into how or if VBS could be involved with it. Evangelism is coming up with a plan to be involved at Battle Creek Fun Days and possibly have the coffee cart at worship in the park.

<u>Parish Ed Report</u> by Christy Schmidt. Parish Ed completed their SMART goals for next year. They are very thankful for a grant from ERPPD of \$250 to help cover the cost of VBS T-shirts.

<u>Parochial Ed Report</u> by Nick Onnen. The school had a closing chapel last week, and the end of the school year is done. All current St. John teaching staff will be returning so there is no need for new hires. The school staff continues to look for more opportunities to be involved in community events to grow the presence of St John. The school staff has decided that the school theme for the 2024-2025 school year will be "Rooted in Christ." The pre-enrollment for K-8 is up for the next school year. Parochial Ed will be reviewing the school handbook and athletic handbook at their next meeting. The school received a \$500 PATCH grant to build a Gaga ball pit.

Early Learning Center (ELC) Report by Deanna Anderson. The ELC also received a PATCH grant to replace some P.E. supplies. A donation from a private donor purchased more items for the "Jesus Time" box. The childcare rate increases will take effect on July 1. Since publishing the new rates there have been 19 children from 11 families that have left the ELC. Training and CEUs for childcare staff are being reviewed to make sure that requirements are fulfilled. The new AED has been installed at the ELC. A technology grant was received and provided 15 tablets, a color printer, a desktop computer, a keyboard, and a mouse. Currently, eighty percent of ELC families are enrolled in autopay. There is work being done to get all families enrolled or establish a pre-payment plan by check if they refuse to use auto-pay. The ELC has also been awarded a \$10,000 Beyond School Bells. This grant is designed to help support and enrich the after-school program at the ELC. The ELC board discussed their SMART goals and will work on finalizing them by the end of the month.

Stewardship Report by Karen Grant. The Stewardship board invited our representative from Elkhorn Valley Bank (Tara Buell-Korth), Chairman Reid Ehrisman, and Vice Chairman Colby Kolm to join their meeting. The group discussed the 2024-2025 budget, as well as the increasing operating debt. Tara recommended that we do not let the operating line of credit exceed \$500,000. The suggestion was to convert a portion of the operating debt to a long-term note. The group discussed and reviewed all information, but no changes were agreed upon at this time.

Old Business - None

New Business-

2024-2025 Proposed Budget - At the last council meeting, the proposed 2024-2025 budgeted income for the ELC was approved. After publishing the new rates some of the ELC families have found other options for childcare. The proposed 2024-2025 budget was adjusted to reflect these changes, which meant the proposed deficit increased by almost \$100,000. The Stewardship Board proposed three different options for the 2024-2025 budget. Option #1 is to leave the budget as it stands, proposing an estimated \$171,229 ministry deficit for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Option #2 is to work backward and offer \$100,000 in support for the ELC and then cut staff and families served to get to that number. Option #3 would be exploring the financial feasibility of the ELC becoming a separate entity. After much discussion, the Council thought that looking into option #3 might be the best-case scenario for both the ELC and the church. A task force will be developed to gather information and provide guidance in exploring the viability of separation. Deanna Anderson made a motion to approve the first quarter of the 2024-2025 proposed budget excluding any raises for staff and the creation of a task force to evaluate the feasibility of the ELC separating into its own 501(c)(3). Task force members are Deanna Anderson, Katie Schnitzler, Colby Kolm, Vince Hoehne, Kelsey Schnoor, and Tiffany Pokorny with assistance from Pastor Lee. The remaining nine months of the budget (including implementing raises) and the viability of the ELC separation will be re-evaluated at the October Voters meeting. Second by Christy Schmidt. Motion passed.

Call Process Update – All congregational member surveys have been reviewed and the information is being compiled to complete the self-study document. Once the document is complete it will be sent to the District President's office. The call process will continue to move forward keeping the expressed needs of the congregation in mind.

St. John Lutheran School News

They grow up fast, don't they? I remember when our oldest was born. We were eager to bring him home, but he didn't pass the car seat test, so we had to wait. While the nurses and doctors could watch our baby, Mrs. Onnen and I invested in our sleep. When it was finally time to go home, I remember putting him in the car seat and thinking, where are all the nurses and doctors? Surely, they aren't going to trust us with this human by ourselves. I felt unequipped.

It's not a great feeling to feel unequipped. While St. John Ministries dove into "The Story," we learned about several heroes of the faith. These people, who had resumes that would intimidate anyone, were also great reminders that God can use anyone.

For instance, Moses was a great hero of faith. He was the first to receive the Ten Commandments. He ordered Pharaoh to let his people go. Can you imagine the bravery to approach a king and demand that he free 600,000 Israelite slaves, not just once but over and over? What a hero of faith! I could never be like Moses.

David was another larger-than-life character. When all the trained Israelite soldiers refused to fight Goliath, David stepped up to win for all of Israel. He later went on to be a great king who was a direct ancestor of Jesus. What a great hero of faith!

Gideon is another of my favorites. He defeated the Midianite army over 100 times the size of his own.

These heroes of faith are remembered for their accomplishments, but again, after reading through the story, we see they weren't all that different from you and me.

When God first called Moses to speak with Pharaoh, Moses protested. "I'm not an eloquent man and I'm slow of speech!" Essentially, he was saying, "I'm unequipped!" Yet, he obeyed God's calling and led over 600,000 men, not counting women and children, to freedom.

David was completely overlooked. When Samuel came to Jesse and said, "One of your sons will be the next king," one by one Jesse presented each son. Finally, Samuel said, "Are you sure this is all you have?" "Well, I guess there's David." Even his own father thought David was unequipped!


Gideon saw the size of the Midianite army and said, "God, are you sure? If you really want me to do this, show me a sign." God gave him a sign, so Gideon said, "God, if that was a sign, give me a sign that that was a sign." Sounds like my kind of guy. Maybe my faith isn't as weak as I thought. God actually agreed with Gideon and said, "You're right, you're not equipped with the right army. Tell your men if they're even a little scared to go home." Gideon reluctantly agreed. Gideon again saw the size of the army and said, "God, are you sure about this?" God said, "You're right, tell your men to go to the river. If they lap the water up like dogs, those are my kind of people. Send the rest home." Three hundred men were left. Gideon had to be thinking, "God, are you crazy? It isn't humanly possible to defeat..." and God would have responded, "Now you're getting the picture."


It was never about Gideon's army. If two armies of equivalent size battled one another, nobody would have seen God. We would have had no testimony to read about in the Bible. It wasn't the fact that Gideon was attacking an army with one that was one-quarter the size of Battle Creek. It wasn't about the size of the army at all. It wasn't that David was the weakest and was overlooked. It wasn't about Moses' ability or inability to speak. It was about their God. God doesn't just call the equipped; He equips the called.


God knows you. He knows your weaknesses, your insecurities, and your imperfect faith. He knows everything about you. The Bible tells us He knows the very number of hairs on your head, yet He uses you to go and tell HIStory.

What is God calling you to do that you don't feel equipped to do? I'm not saying you need to quit your job to become a pastor or move to a foreign country and become a missionary. I am saying to be bold in your faith and take a step forward in sharing HIStory. Start reading through Scripture. Find a small group Bible study to learn more. Lead your family in reading through a devotion every night. Have a conversation with someone else who is unequipped and point them to Jesus. What is God calling you to do? Who is He calling you to go and tell His story to? Maybe you have someone in your head but you don't know them well enough... or maybe they know you too well. They were there that one time...

There's one more thing we're unequipped for. We're unequipped to live up to God's perfection. But luckily, it's not about us. It's about Him. It's about God's son, Jesus, who took our place, so that when God sees us, He sees the perfection of Christ. All God asks in return is to live a life that tells HIS STORY.
